HP PAC Chairman's Message

2014 was an important year for HP and its ongoing turnaround. It was a year of continued innovations and improvements that are leading HP back to its rightful place as an industry leader. It also marked an important year for the turnaround of the HP Political Action Committee (HP PAC).

Through the hard work of our dedicated PAC Board of Directors, the Corporate Affairs team, and the HP employees who contributed, HP PAC made significant progress.

Expanding on the foundation we built in 2013, HP PAC took additional steps to educate employees about issues impacting HP, encourage employees to participate in the mid-term elections, and support the PAC with voluntary contributions.

Our work over the two-year cycle paid tangible dividends as we increased receipts by 59% and more than doubled participation by HP employees. The PAC raised nearly \$650,000 from the voluntary contributions of over 1,600 HP employees. These figures are a record high for the PAC and show we are on the right track to accelerating the growth of our program.

These generous contributions allowed HP PAC to donate more than \$590,000 to over 200 federal and state candidates and committees in 2014. Each donation helped HP build relationships and educate lawmakers on the issues that directly impact our business. And, HP PAC continued to demonstrate its commitment to bipartisanship by giving to candidates on both sides of the political aisle, maintaining a 49% Democrat, 51% Republican split.

In light of the HP separation in October 2015, we expect many changes this year. However, we continue to pursue Meg's goal to be the number one PAC in the technology industry. Our plan to accelerate growth begins with every HP employee understanding that HP's relationship with government is key to our future.

HP PAC is the sole means for HP to have a voice in the political process. We need your help, and we know we can count on you to redouble your efforts in 2015.

In the meantime, please know that the HP PAC Board is very grateful for the support of its members. If you have not yet joined, we encourage you to learn more at ourhppac.com. With the continued support of its members, we are confident that HP PAC will continue its growth and expansion in 2015.

PAC Giving Criteria

HP PAC Political Contributions

The HP PAC Board of Directors determines which candidates to support using these criteria:

- The candidate champions and defends HP's top priorities
- The candidate represents significant HP populations and facilities
- The candidate is a high-impact leader whose voice carries particular sway within his or her caucus or region
- HP's effort to build a strong relationship will help us stand out from other supporters

Federal Contribution Limits

HP PAC may contribute up to a maximum of:

- \$5,000 per election to a federal candidate's campaign committee. That means \$5,000 may be given for the candidate's primary election and \$5,000 for the general election, resulting in a total of \$10,000 per two-year election cycle.
- \$15,000 per calendar year to a national party committee, such as the Democratic and Republican National, Senatorial, and Congressional Campaign Committees.
- \$5,000 per year to an incumbent's leadership PAC. Leadership PACs may be sponsored by Members of Congress to support other candidates from their political party in order to position themselves for future leadership spots. These are separate from a Member's campaign committee.
- \$5,000 per year to a state or local party committee.



HP PAC Mission

HP PAC has been organized to encourage the preservation and furtherance of the democratic system of government and the free enterprise system in the United States, to promote the high technology industry in general and the interests of the community, the Company and its shareholders and employees in particular, and to promote good citizenship through personal and financial participation in the elective process.

Disclaimer

Participation in the HP PAC is completely voluntary, and your decision to participate or not participate will have no impact whatsoever on your position with HP. Contributions to HP PAC are used for political purposes and are not deductible for federal income tax purposes. All PAC contributors must be U.S. citizens or be permanent residents in the U.S. Federal law requires us to use our best efforts to collect and report the name, mailing address, occupation and the name of employer of individuals whose contributions exceed \$200 in a calendar year. HP does not provide political contributions that could create even the appearance of undue influence.

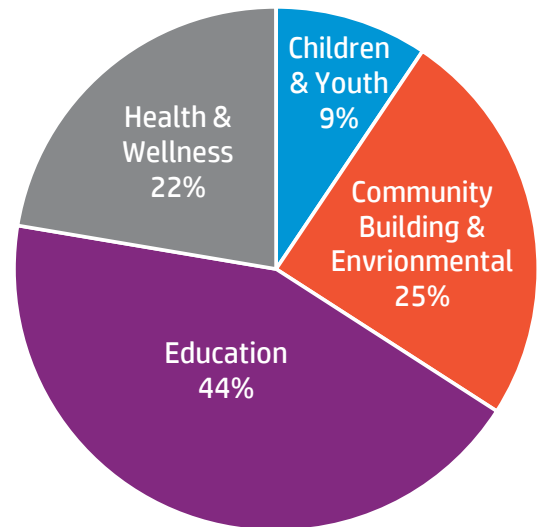

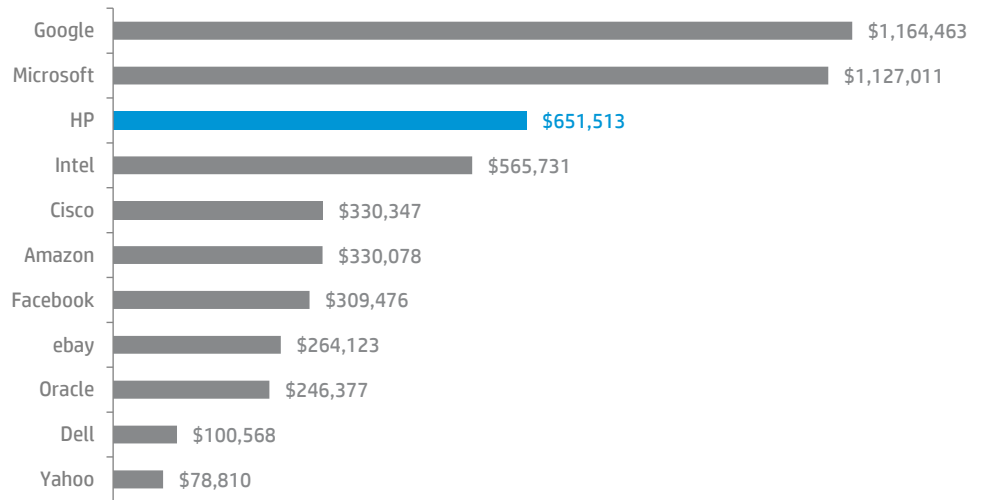

2014 Receipts (01/01-12/31/2014)

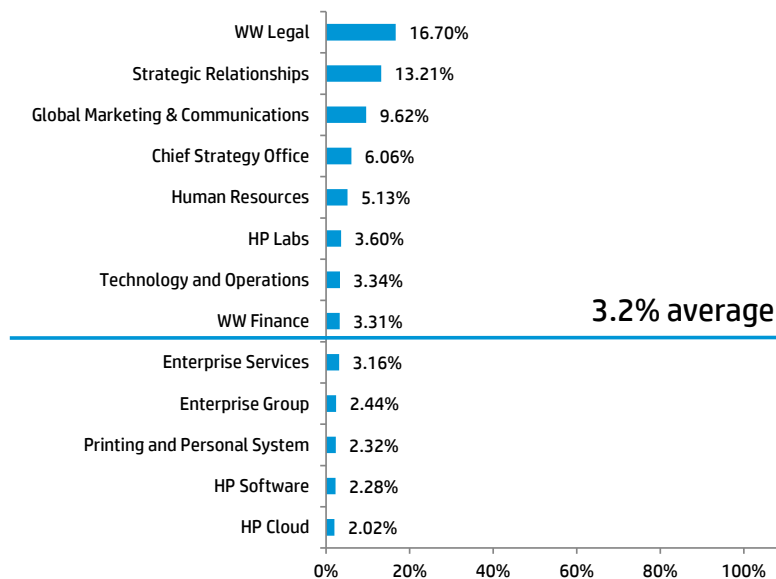

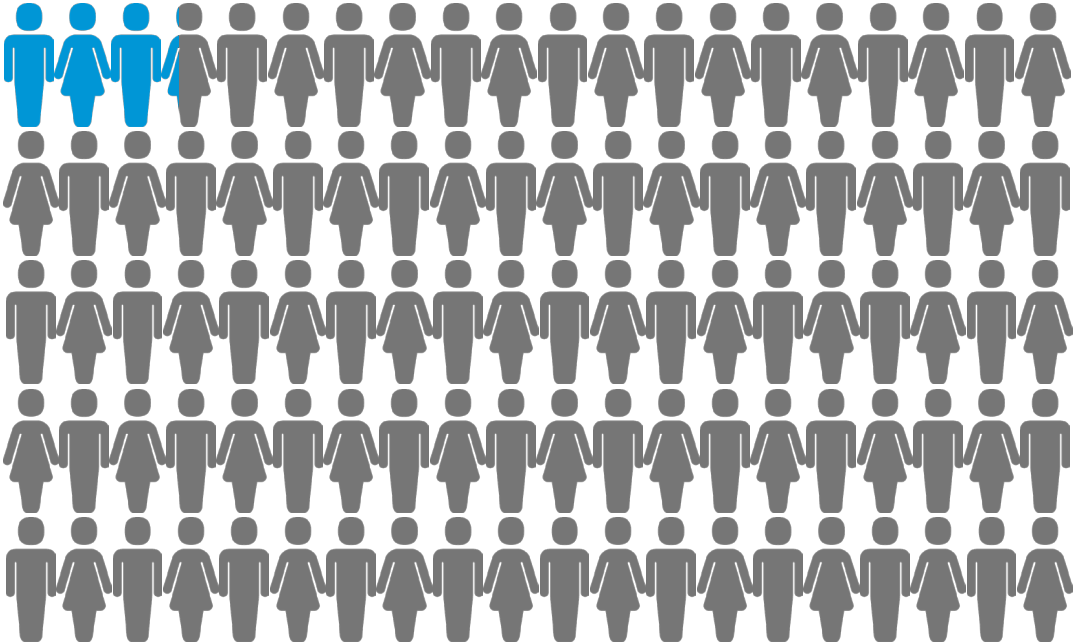

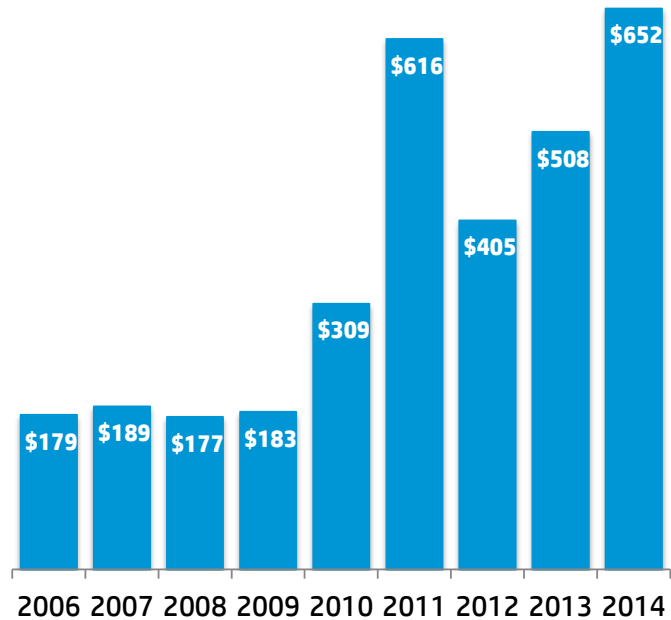

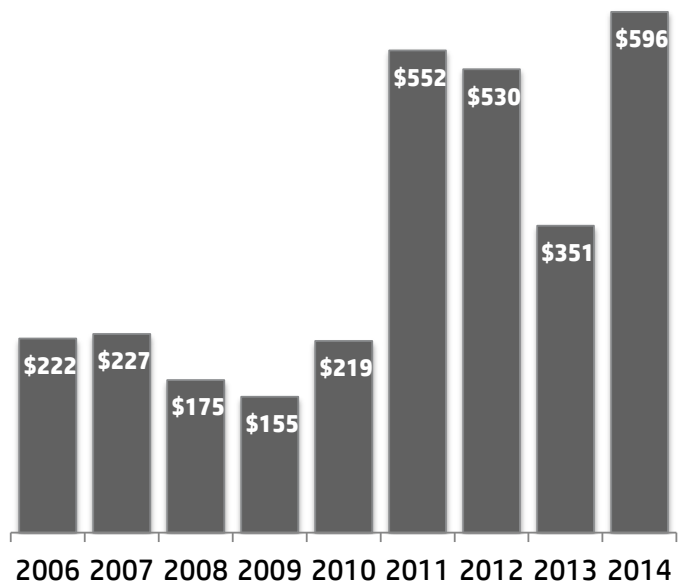
Historical Receipts

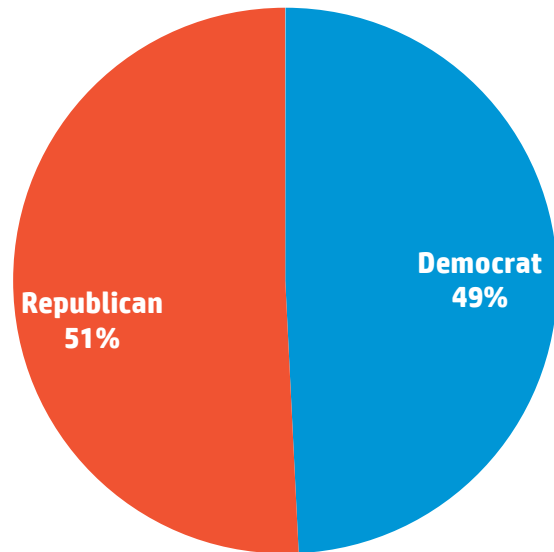
Total disbursements (in thousands) for the last nine years

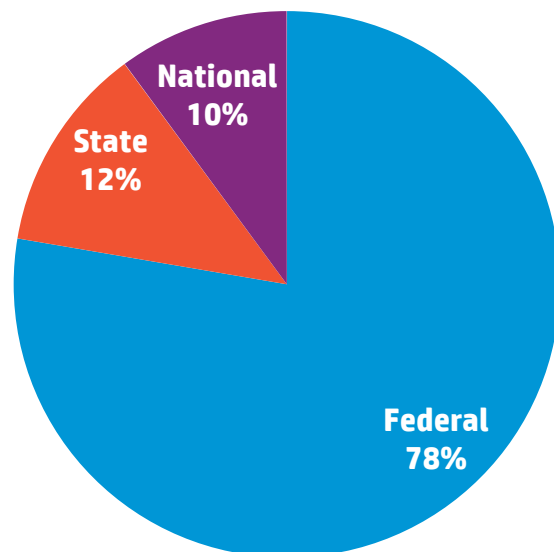
2014 Party Distribution
